Is the scope and significance of the problem clearly documented?</p> <p>4. <p>Results</p> <p>1. Are results informative?</p> <p>2. Are figures/table support the findings?</p>	
<p>Discussion / Conclusion</p> <p>1. What do the main findings mean?</p> <p>2. Strengths/limitations of the study?</p> <p>3. Are the important effects overlooked?</p> <p>4. Does the research answer its original question?</p> <p>5. What future direction does the current work lead to?</p>
